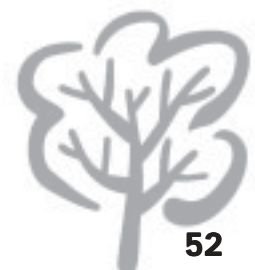

3. Build the capacity of POs and their members										
a. Develop and implement a social development programs for members of CBFM tenure holders, including women, youth, senior citizens, differently able and others										
b. Develop and implement appropriate organizational and ENR training programs										
4. Formulate/update and implement community management plans (CMP) and work plans										
a. Form and capacitate PO planning team										
b. Prepare community management plan and work plans										
c. Implement and monitor work plans in accordance with CMPs										
5. Encourage the participation of CBFM tenure holders										
a. Conduct activities to motivate POs in improving their organizations based on the results of the assessment										
b. Facilitate networking among POs as a collective force in CBFM

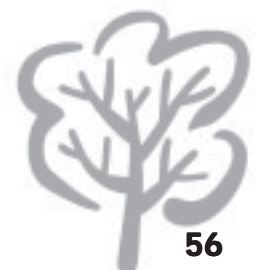

RESOURCE MANAGEMENT, CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION										
1. Promote sustainable and ecology- friendly conservation and protection measures										
a. Identify existing indigenous knowledge skills and practices (IKSP)										
b. Promote sustainable and ecology-friendly IKSP										
c. Promote indigenous plant species in forest restoration										
d. Promote organic and natural farming systems/ passive fishing method										
e. Establish/install appropriate marking on the ground that will distinguish the protection from production zones within CBFM tenured areas, i.e.. greenbelts, billboards, signages, etc.										
f. Establish, protect, maintain and preserve sanctuaries establishments and improvements of sanctuaries										
g. Formulate or enhance and implement community based fire/pest/soil erosion/ sedimentation/tidal inundation prevention/ management plan										
2. Implement collaborative forest protection and conservation efforts										
a. Re-orient and capacitate LGUs in their forest protection roles										
b. Deputize qualified barangay officials and PO members as SDENROs										
c. Coordinate with task forces/groups addressing environmental crimes i.e., National Anti-Environmental Crimes Task Force (NAECTAF), etc.										
d. Forge agreement with telecommunications companies for use of their network (e.g. free text, special numbers, hotline numbers)

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3. Work for speedy resolutions of environmental cases										
a. Advocate for prescription of time limit in resolution of cases										
b. Mobilize resources to fund case documentation and litigation										
c. Advocate for the creation of special courts or appoint special prosecutors for environmental cases										
4. Ensure transparency and accountability in the performance of duties in forest protection and law enforcement										
a. Review, revise/sustain existing sanctions for erring ENROs (SDENROs, forest rangers), and other public officials and employees										
b. Enforce sanctions for erring ENROs and other public officials and employees										
c. Post photos and listings of confiscated forest products including equipment, conveyance, etc." in visible public places										
d. Use multimedia (print, broadcast, electronic) in disseminating records of confiscation, disposition, etc.										
FOREST DEVELOPMENT										
1. Improve system of site assessment and production of quality planting stocks										
a. Conduct site-species suitability assessment										
b. Revive and establish identified seed production areas										
c. Certify seeds collected from SPAs										
d. Revive and establish nurseries consistent with site-suitability assessment results

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2. Enhance forest cover and productivity of CBFM tenured areas										
a. Reforest degraded areas for production or protection purposes										
b. Establish agroforestry and tree plantation in open areas										
c. Restore stands in natural forests										
SUSTAINABLE UTILIZATION										
1. Simplify requirements and streamline harvesting, permitting and transporting procedures for timber/wood and non-timber/non-wood forestlands resources										
a. Community to develop their harvesting guidelines to be used in CMPs										
b. Review operational guidelines and procedures on permitting systems										
2. Secure the rights of forestlands managers to access and benefit from the resources found within CBFM tenured areas										
a. Review terms and conditions of existing MOAs, JVAs and other contracting agreements										
b. Enter into agreements with partners										
3. Monitor and assess resource-use activities to ensure sustainability										
a. Conduct regular monitoring and assessment of resource utilization activities										
b. Implement recommendations based on the results of the assessment										



STRATEGIES/ACTIVITIES	YEAR									
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DEVELOPING LIVELIHOOD AND ENTERPRISES IN FORESTLANDS AND ANCESTRAL DOMAIN COMMUNITIES										
1. Enhance existing livelihood support facilities and develop new, appropriate livelihood, if necessary										
a. Conduct assessment of PO readiness to manage livelihood activities										
b. Implement livelihood and enterprise development programs										
c. Install/establish needed support facilities										
2. Launch and implement food security and self-sufficiency program										
a. Conduct nutrition education program										
b. Identify nutritional needs										
c. Identify which products the community can produce to satisfy its own nutritional needs										
d. Coordinate with LGUs to avail other nutrition programs										
e. Intensify the Food Always in the House (FAITH) program including nutrition greenbelts										
3. Promote market-based, conservation supportive economic initiatives that pass evaluation of being economically viable/feasible, culturally acceptable and ecologically sound										
a. Conduct market analysis										
b. Conduct fora and workshops										
c. Develop community-managed wood and non-wood forest product enterprises and complement with other livelihood and service-related projects that may be considered										
d. Establish ecological tourism areas if requested										
e. Issue guidelines on community-managed ecological tourism in CBFM areas										



STRATEGIES/ACTIVITIES	YEAR									
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4. Set up or improve systems, mechanisms, and technologies on livelihood and enterprises within CBFM holder organizations										
a. Assist CBFM tenure holder organizations in the formulation of policies on livelihood and enterprise management systems										
b. Monitor the progress of the livelihood projects and enterprises regularly										
c. Adopt tested and appropriate technologies										
d. Develop and implement - savings and credit scheme - re-investment plan										
5. Build and strengthen partnerships in production, product development and marketing										
a. Assist in negotiation between willing and capable CBFM tenure holders and potential investors and buyers										
b. Link CBFM tenure holders with industry associations e.g. chambers, cooperatives, business development service providers, etc. for possible membership and/or partnership										
c. Compile schedule of various trade fairs or exhibits and co-sponsor participation of CBFM tenure holders										
d. Mobilize the CBFM tenure holders federation to provide or gather data in market analysis
